The NIHR School for Public Health Research is a partnership between University of Bristol; University of Cambridge; Fuse; The Centre for Translational Research in Public Health, a collaboration between Newcastle, Durham, Northumbria, Sunderland and Teesside Universities; Imperial College London; the LiLaC collaboration between the Universities of Liverpool and Lancaster; The London School for Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM); University of Sheffield, University of Exeter, the PHRESH collaboration between the Universities of Birmingham, Warwick and Keele.
